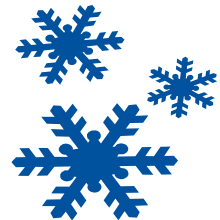

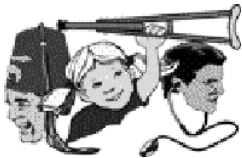

A Variety of Shrine Events Raise Millions for Hospitals!

Shriners throughout North America donate their valuable free time to hold a variety of special events each year to benefit Shriners Hospitals for Children. These events provide an important contribution by helping to fund the hospitals and raise awareness about the Shriners fraternity and its philanthropy.

In 2007 alone, 522 events held by Shriners temples (I still call it a temple) raised more than \$14.1 million for Shriners Hospitals. While some temples sponsored fundraisers like newspaper crusades, rodeos, dances and fishing and golf tournaments, others hosted events that are a bit out of the ordinary.

For the past 36 years, the Jackson Hole Shrine Club in Wyoming, (affiliated with Kalif Shriners), has held cutter

horse races to benefit (SHC), Salt Lake City. During the two day event, held each February, 40 teams compete in a series of races down a snow covered track. A cutter is similar to a horse drawn chariot, with wheels on each side. One person sits on the cutter and directs the two horse team during the race.

Each year, the races draw between 3,000 to 5,000 spectators and raise between \$17,000 and \$20,000, said Bob Zimmer, president of the Jackson Hole Shrine Club. Funds to benefit the Hospital are raised through Calcutta betting an auction style type of wagering were people continue to "buy" teams at higher prices throughout the event.

Zimmer who is also the Teton County Sheriff, admits that organizing the cutter races each year can be time consuming, but believes it is well worth the effort. "When you see one youngster who has the benefit of receiving care at (SHC), it puts it all in perspective".

In Spokane Washington, El Katif Shriners race about 10,000 bright yellow ducks down the Spokane River to raise funds for (SHC) in their city each year. The ducks aren't alive though they are plastic.

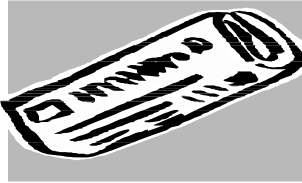
Members of the community sponsor the ducks by buying raffle tickets. Ticket numbers are affixed to the bottom of each duck. On race day, a crane lifts a container filled with all of the ducks high above the river and dumps them all at once. The ducks float about a mile down the river to the official finish gate. Sponsors of the first five ducks to finish the race win prizes. About 500 people attend the duck race every year, said John Roertsn, an El Katif Shriner and coordinator of the 2008 race, which will be held on September 21. Last years duck race raised \$33,500. Since 1991, El Katif has donated a little more than \$533,000 in race proceeds to the (SHC) in Spokane and to the patient's transportation fund. Robertson has volunteered to work on the event since becoming a Shriner five years ago. "It's rewarding to me as a Shriner, because it shows the community that we are fortunate enough to have a "SHC" in Spokane." He said.

Following on the wheels of last years huge success last year, the Roar on the shore motorcycle rally in Erie, PA, will be back better than ever in summer 2008. From celebrities to nationally known musical acts, the event is planed for July 17 – 20. Organizers have announced that the proceeds from this years four day Roar on the Shore will benefit "SHC" in Erie, PA. Academy Award nominated actor Peter Fonda, the original "Easy Rider," will be returning to the "Roar" to serve again as Grand Marshall and lead rider in the kick – off parade Thursday, July 17.

With so many extremely worthwhile charities it was not difficult for the board to choose this one. Anyone who knows anything about "SHC" and the amazing work they do, will agree we made a great choice

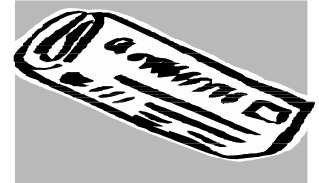

Brethren, to answer the query.

What is the Cabiri?

Most Nobles have no idea what the Cabiri is. This quick article is aimed at answering that.

The pupose of the Cabiri is threefold: 1) to promote good fellowship among Past Potentates and stimulate an active interest in all Shrine activities and support the Shrine Hospital for Children; 2) to establish headquarters at all Imperial Council sessions, Shrine Director sessions and regional sessions where Past Potentates may assemble, shake the sand from their sandals and renew old acquaintances, and 3) to acquaint new Past Potentates with the ancient and abstruse mysteries of the Cabiri.

When a Noble has completed his year of probation as a Potentate (as required by the ritual), has tried his level best, has admitted his shortcomings (if any) and admits he was the best Potentate during his year he becomes eligible for membership in the sacred rites of the Cabiri. These are the requirements for entry into the International Order of the Cabiri.

A Past Potentate needs to be *invited* to join the local chapter and Aahmes was the first local Cabiri chapter to be formed.

Meetings of the local Cabiri are called as needed. There are no scheduled meetings. It has been a custom of the Aahmes chapter to have a meeting in the fall of the year and invite the incoming Potentate to attend, present his buget and appointments, as well as outline his programs for the next year.

Douglas E. Maxwell Imperial Potentate 2008-2009



During the 2008 Imperial Council Session, held in St. Louis June 29-July 3, Douglas E. Maxwell of Chesterfield, Mo., was elected the Imperial Potentate of the Shrine International, making him the highest-ranking Shriner in the world. As Imperial Potentate, he is serving his eleventh term as a member of the Board of Directors for the Shriners fraternity. Maxwell is also serving as the Chairman of the Board of Directors for Shriners Hospitals for Children, a health care system of 22 hospitals in the U.S., Mexico and Canada.

In college at the University of Kansas, Maxwell studied architectural engineering and finance, receiving his degree in 1969. He received his Master of Business Administration degree from Southern Illinois University in 1975.

In the early '70s, Maxwell joined the U.S. Air Force as a second lieutenant. He flew the world routes of the Military Airlift Command, including missions to Europe, South America, Africa, Southeast Asia and Vietnam. For his distinguished service during the Vietnam War, he received both Vietnamese Combat Service Medals and the Air Force Commendation Medal. At the end of the war in 1975, he departed the military as a captain.

Maxwell and his father began a manufacturing company in 1975, building checkout counter conveyors and speed reducers. Today, Maxwell Manufacturing Co. has grown into the third largest builder of these conveyors in America.

During his 10 years on the Board of Directors, Imperial Sir Maxwell has served as chairman of the International Development Committee, the Buildings and Equipment Committee and the Fleming-Florence Committee. He has also served on the Investment Committee and the Planning Committee.

Maxwell is a Past Potentate of Moolah Shriners in St. Louis. He is a 33rd degree member of the Scottish Rite, a Knight Templar in the York Rite, and a member of Beacon Masonic Lodge #3 and the International Order of DeMolay Legion of Honor. He is also an emeritus member of the St. Louis Shriners Hospital Board of Governors, serving on the Applications Committee and Buildings and Equipment Committee.

Maxwell is a member of the Aircraft Owners and Pilots Association and also the Missouri Pilots Association. He holds a commercial pilot's license and instructor's pilot's license.

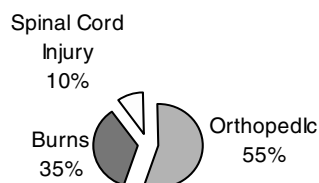
